All pupils made the expected progress of 2 levels (equivalent to 6 sub levels) between the end of year 2 and the end of year 6. In fact the majority exceeded that with a health proportion achieving 7,8,9 and even 10 sub levels of progress.

Looked at in conjunction with the attainment data available in table 1 it shows a very healthy picture of pupil achievement across their time at school both in terms of attainment and progress.

Attainment

The attainment measures show that pupils are achieving above and in some instances well above national averages for Years 2 and Year 6. The work to support learners last year in the form of additional support seems to have had a clear impact. The intervention program needs to continue across all classes.

There are a healthy proportion of pupils achieving the higher levels across all strands.

Boys and girls perform at similar levels of attainment which is a positive indicator of the equality of opportunity in the school.

Progress

Pupils are making good to outstanding progress across the school by the time they reach Year 6.

In other years pupils are also making progress at good levels in most classes. Year 1 looks relatively weaker however this is due to no formal moderation at the entry point in Year 1 from Reception class which means the levels attained all seem slightly inflated.

Areas of development

Progress and attainment across the school in writing is comparatively lower than all other core areas. A whole school focus to develop pupil writing will be part of the new literacy policy and form a core part of the new Literacy curriculum being purchased for Sep 2015.

Moderation of pupil work to take place across all year groups both at the beginning and the end of year to help ensure consistency and validity of the data produced.
