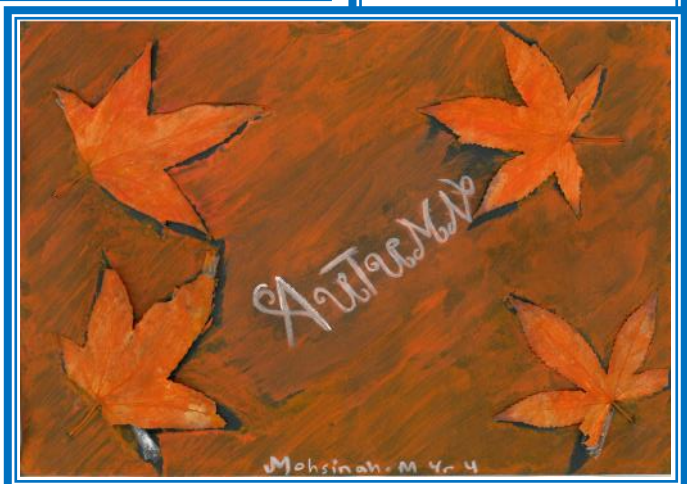
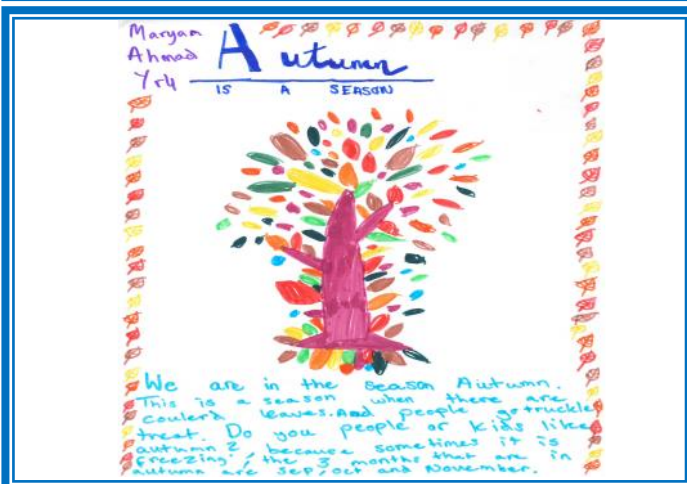

Below is an update from the Governing Board for the Winter Term;

Governor meetings and monitoring

Governors met in September and December for full Board meetings. In September we looked in detail at the results of the GL Progress tests and the SATS results. We were pleased with the overall results as Noor Ul Islam continues to achieve above national and local averages for attainment. This is a testimony to the hard work of the children and teachers and of course parents; we continue to work in unison for the success of our children.

A number of Governor Monitoring Visits took place over the last term and Governors looked at Safeguarding, premises issues, Anti Bullying, Complaints Log, Progress and Attainment of pupils as well as Attendance and Punctuality. When we come into school, we will sometimes come unannounced and will carry out a monitoring inspection in the same way Ofsted would carry out an inspection of particular areas. We feedback to the Headteacher and we work together as a team.

We have seen a number of new roles for existing staff members and as governors we come into school once a term for a staff surgery/drop in, where staff can speak to us about anything. We are pleased that staff have settled in their new roles well.

We would like to thank Ms Imrana Naz for dedication and commitment to the governing body as she steps down from her role as Staff Representative on the Board. Ms Naz was a Staff Representative for nearly 8 years and we are immensely grateful for all her efforts. We look forward to another member of staff to take up this role.

We are also looking for a Community Governor, to ensure that we have a diverse range of people from the community. Community Governors should not have any children in the school, and if you know anyone who would be good for this role and can bring their expertise and skills of any area, to our school then please email jabeen@noorulislam.org.uk.

The new members have a wide range of experiences and skills and have already contributed greatly to the Board.

With the new Associate Members, there has also been some changes in the structure of the existing Sub Committees. There has been some change in the Chairs of Sub Committees, with Jabeen Zaidi moving from Chair of ASC SC to Chair of SPW, and Nailah Ashraf taking position as the new Chair of ASC. Sammy Elwardany will continue to support the school as an External Advisor to the Board.

Curriculum

The Achievement Standards and curriculum subcommittee will be working closely with the Head Teacher over the next few months to help refine and enhance the school curriculum in order to further our children's academic and social development. Work has already begun in key areas, the new English curriculum, the scheme primarily focuses on books and reading. This will come into effect in the new year in insha'Allah, with the Math Mastery system starting next academic year. This will compliment the school's new hands on approach to science. The Islamic Studies department have already implemented new systems and procedures to bolster Islamic Learning at the school.

The school ran some focus groups to get feedback about homework and parents were asked about their experience with homework. The headteacher will be looking to implement some of the feedback that was given to make the homework an even better learning experience at home.

Enrichment

Governors believe that Noor Ul Islam Primary School's Enrichment activities are excellent. We have seen some amazing opportunities this term such as a Robotics workshop in the Apple store, a trip to the Houses of Parliament, raising money for charity with the Fun Run, the feed the homeless project, a crisp packet recycling initiative, a visit from bestselling author Hafsah Dabiri, Choose your Hijab day and most recently an interfaith visit from a Reverend who spoke about Christmas which was followed by a special assembly delivered by Ustaadh Maajid on the Islamic perspective of Christmas.

Open Evening

We were pleased to see so many new faces at the Open Evening in October. Prospective parents were keen to look around and were given exemplary tours by the wonderful Year 6 Prefects. I heard one parent comment that she was so impressed at one prefect at how polite and well mannered she was and she was able to answer all the questions she was asked masha'Allah. Open evenings are an important part of showing what the school has to offer and with lots of staff, pupils and governors to talk to, it is a good way for prospective parents to get a holistic view of the school.

As Salaamu alaikum wa rahmatullaahi wa barakaatuh

Alhamdulillah the Trust and its various departments have been busy with events and projects aimed at developing the community and raising funds for Project Rebuild.

We held 5 jamaats for Eid Ul Fitr (4th June) and Eid Ul Adha (11th August) at Noor Ul Islam. Unfortunately due to space restrictions we do not have space to accommodate sisters. We are looking at potential outdoor spaces in order to include our sisters until Project Rebuild is complete insha'Allah.

Noor Ul Islam's Aalimah department held monthly talks covering topics such as Hijab in Islam, Impact of social media, Role models and birthdays. Shaykh Haitham al-Haddad led Jummah at Noor Ul Islam on 21st June 2019. After Jummah he visited the Project Rebuild site and was surprised by the size of the building and number of services that will be available masha'Allah.

Noor Ul Islam held its 15th annual Summer Fete on 6th and 7th July 2019 at Sir George Monoux College which raised more than £15,000 for Project Rebuild.

Noor Ul Islam is a founding member of Waltham Forest Council of Mosques (WFCOM) which consists of 9 Mosques who work together for the benefit of the Muslim community especially in the borough. Noor Ul Islam led the first Eid Dinner on 15th August on behalf of WFCOM where approximately 250 attendees celebrated the positive contributions of Muslims. The event also gave an opportunity for attendees to give feedback on WFCOM past work and suggest future projects.

Noor Ul Islam held its annual Interfaith Dinner at Leyton 6th Form College on 12th November in order to promote interfaith dialogue where more than 100 guests participated. Noor Ul Islam held an Autumn Fayre & clothes collection for HRF at Leyton Sixth Form College on 16th November.

With regards to Project Rebuild, Alhamdulillah we are almost 75% complete. Glazing work has been completed and scaffolding has been removed. Onlookers have welcomed and given positive comments on the design mash'Allah. The internal work has started and will take approximately 6 months to complete should we have the funds available. The remaining balance to complete stands at approximately £3.5 million. Supporters are encouraged to ask friends and family members to donate and give Qarze Hasana in order to complete the project.

The Trust thanks staff, volunteers, parents and students for their ongoing support and duas.

Quraan Reading

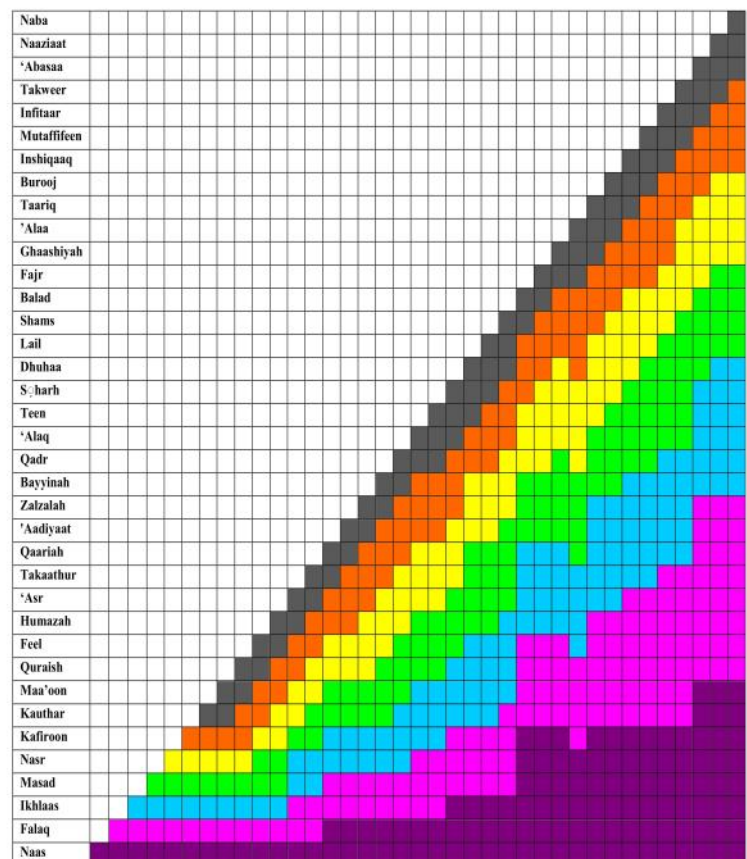
The Islamic Studies department has been tweaking various aspects of our curriculum. In our continued drive to improve students Quraan reading ability, we have introduced an extra ten minutes of free reading for those students that have reached that level. This is given at the beginning of each Islamic studies lesson.

Quraan Revision

The Prophet, peace be upon him stated that the Quraan is like a camel, if it is not tied it will run away from you. Quraan revision is always harder than Quraan memorisation. We find that children are always reluctant to revise so we have devised a chart to make this easier for them and for you as parents! Just read off the chart accordingly to see which surahs are to be read on which days. If you can encourage them to follow this daily, their juz 'Amma will be as solid as Surah Faatiha, inshaa Allaah.

Juz 'Amma Daily Revision Chart

In order for your child to retain the Soorahs they have learnt they must revise frequently. Please ensure that your child revises the Soorahs they know as is laid out in the revision chart below. Keep it somewhere visible, like on the fridge.

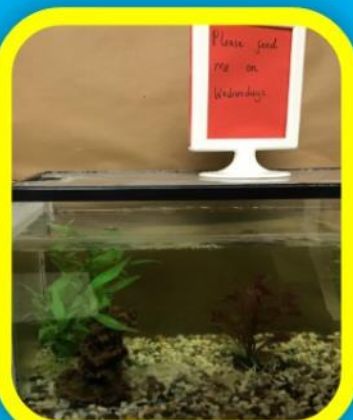

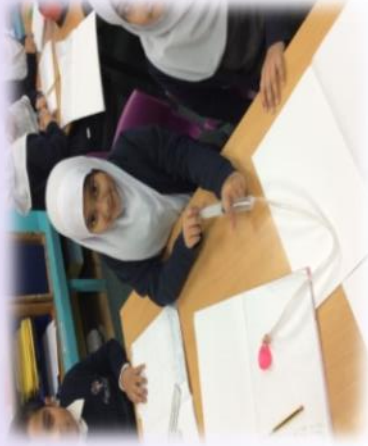

We are one of the founding members of the Al-Noor annual fun run. This year was the 3rd annual run that took place. The Fun Run raises money for a number of different charities, this year it was for Project Rebuild. On Sunday 13th October 2019, the pupils who were selected to represent Noor Ul Islam Primary school ran a variety of races, between 1k, 2k and 5k. The school had a competition between each class and **Year 3 won**, raising a massive amount of **£2,877.13**, with Year 4 in 2nd place raising £2,730.79. Taqabbala Allahu minna wa minkum, Ameen!

HOMELESS PROJECT

This term the PTFA organised a homeless project to help our wider community. We collaborated with Cann Hall Masjid and Palmers Green Masjid who distribute food to the homeless on a weekly basis. As a PTFA we decided to make food packs and blessing packs with basic necessities.

The aim of this project was not only to help our community but for children to have a learning experience by understanding other people's needs, appreciating what they have and being grateful for it.

Alhumdulillah, with the help and support of the parents and the community we received an overwhelming amount of donations to make these packs. The children at school were absolutely amazing and very eager and worked very hard helping the PTFA put all the packs together.

We distributed these packs in two different area, the first in Stratford Centre on Sunday 7th December and the second in Holborn on Saturday 14th December. This was an absolute amazing experience, we had children and parents from the school come and help distribute the packs. On both days there were so many homeless people and we were able to distribute all our packs. The homeless were very grateful and pleased to receive these from the children and showed their gratitude.

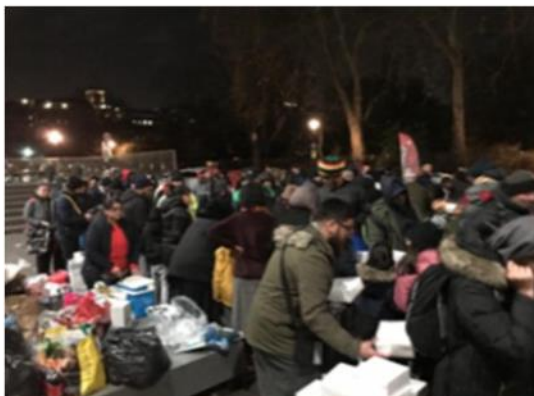
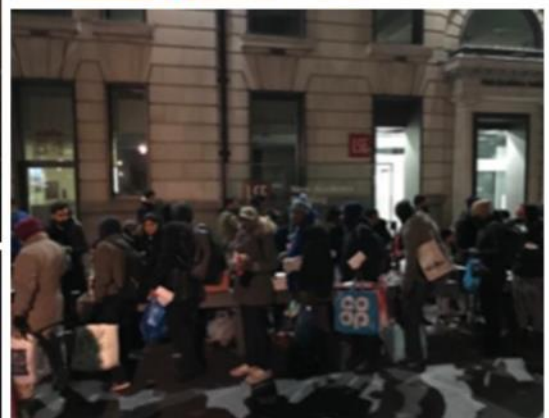

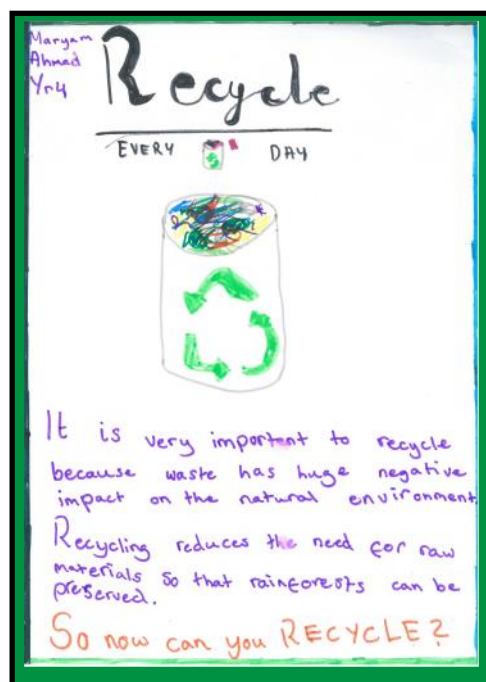




Recycling

As you all must be aware the school are now working with Terracycle, a company that specialises in recycling items that are conventionally thrown into the bin. This scheme is designed to help reduce the number of packets of crisps that are sent to landfill or disposed of in the sea. The scheme collects all crisp packets from any manufacturer to re-purpose into plastic items such as picnic tables and benches.

The school collects empty packets daily, our kids are doing a fantastic job in using the recycling bin! We then send it off to Terracycle with the help of school parents. Based on the weight of the packets we send we will also be able to claim cash from the company, insha'Allah. Thank you for your support with this new scheme, we are one step closer to going green!

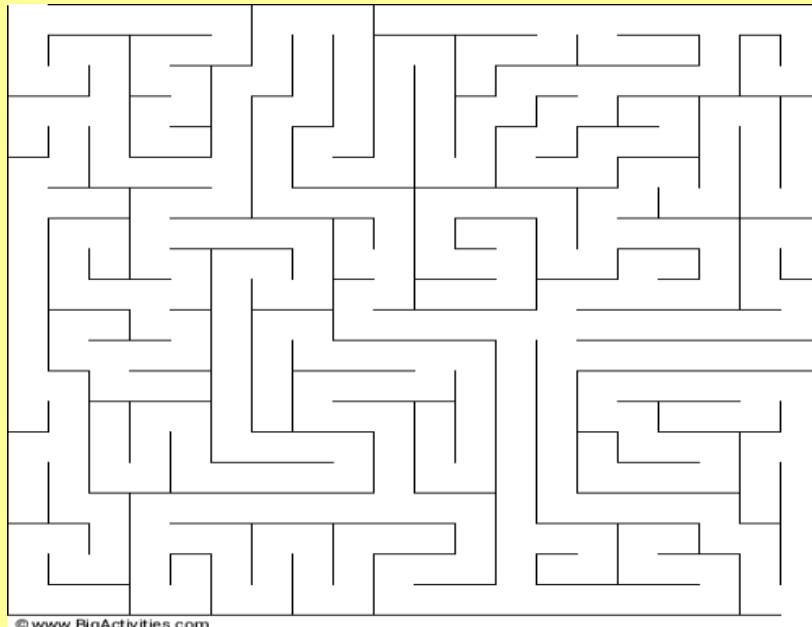
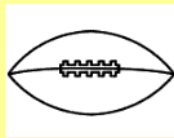
