

### How much do we charge?

When your child is offered a place at our Pre-school, you will be required to pay a £30 registration fee (non-refundable). If you are unable to make this payment please speak with the pre-school manager at the time of your child's registration.

### Universal 15 Hour Funding

Every child between the ages of 3 and 5 years is entitled to receive the Free Early Education Entitlement (FEEE) for up to 15 hours a week at a registered early years setting. Noor Ul Islam Pre-school is registered to receive this grant for children, so parents will not need to pay any additional top-up fee unless your child is attending additional hours.

### 30 Hour Funding

Since September 2017, working parents who meet certain eligibility criteria will be able to apply for up to 30 hours FEEE (15 *additional* hours). Noor ul Islam Pre-school is also able to provide these extra hours if there is space available. If any parent would like apply for this, please check your eligibility, and notify the Pre-school once you have received your 30 hour scheme code.

### What is Noor UI Islam Pre-School about?

Noor UI Islam Pre-school is a friendly and caring establishment which caters for 3-5 year olds. We aim to provide a variety of activities and learning experiences which promote and stimulate the development of all our children

to their full potential. We achieve this by:

- Teaching the children through means of opportunity, encouragement, support and reward,
- Ensuring the well-being, protection, health and safety of all our children, and
- Introducing the children to the basic morals and principals of Islam.

We are a fully inclusive setting and welcome children of all abilities, races, and faiths. We do not discriminate against children with special educational needs, as we believe that equality and diversity adds to the success of our Pre-school.

### What do we teach?

We work within an Islamic ethos and teach Islam as a way of life rather than a separate subject.



### How do we teach?

Islam and modern-day research on child development teaches us that children must be supported according to their unique needs. We believe that children display their abilities through natural play and that it is our job to evaluate and plan for them individually. We do not view any child as passing or failing, but rather as a unique individual who has the potential to develop and flourish in his/her unique way, In-shaa Allah.

It is our belief that children should never be forced, pressurised, compared against others, or made to feel inferior / inadequate when introduced to new experiences.

### Staff

Noor UI Islam Pre-school aims to provide a high adult to child ratio. As a minimum we have a ratio of 1 adult to 8 children; however, we normally provide a 1:6 adult to child ratio.

We employ staff who are qualified with relevant childcare qualifications, and have experience working with children. We invest in training our staff through attending regular relevant courses on childcare and education, as well as Health and safety, First Aid, Food Safety, Safeguarding and Special Educational Needs.

The staff at Noor UI Islam Pre-school believes that children need love, security, and the freedom to learn and interact with others. We will strive to provide such an environment and will use praise and encouragement to support each child to achieve their potential.

### Ofsted

We are registered with Ofsted. Our most recent inspection took place in May 2022, the Pre-school has been awarded a 'Good' rating masha'Allah. Our report can be accessed on the pre-school website or the Ofsted website. This achievement reflects on the commitment and hard work of everyone involved.

### When can you apply?

Parents can apply for their child to be placed on our waiting list once their child reaches the age of 2. Our waiting list is long, so we ask parents to be patient whilst waiting for a place for their child. Application forms can be picked up from the Pre-school or downloaded from our website (Pre-school Admissions) and must be returned to the pre-school when your child is 2 years of age or above.
