<u>Maths</u>

Unit 1

In this unit, children begin by sorting and grouping objects up to 10. They will count to 10 and focus on 'one more' and 'one less'.

Unit 2

This unit, which builds on Unit 1: Numbers to 10, introduces children to the part-whole model, focusing on different ways of partitioning numbers to 10. Children use the part-whole model to help them write and compare number bonds.

<u>English</u>

Phonics

-Revision of Phase 2 and 3 sounds. Spelling and handwriting of phase 2 and 3 sounds

-Recognise and practise tricky words

-Introduction of Phase 4 Phonemes

Text: Cave Baby by Julia Donaldson and Emily Gravett

Children will be reading and writing words containing each of the 40+ phonemes

Introduction to capital letters, full stops, question marks and exclamation marks to demarcate

<u>Qur'an, Arabic and Islamic Studies</u>

Quran

Surah revision from Nas to Al Adiyat New surahs Zalzalah to Bayinnah Reciting slowly with madd and ghunnah Short vowels fatha, dhamma and kasra in words

Arabic

To recognise and say each of the Arabic letters in all 3 positions: beginning, middle and end

Learning Arabic words to be able to say a word for each Arabic letter

Islamic Studies The Etiquettes of Giving Salaam To be able to implement all the classroom rules Know their Muslim identity Knowing the etiquettes of using the toilet Story of Adam alaihi salam-Paradise and Hell
