# **English**

We will be reading the books **Templeton Twins with the The Boy In The Tower By Polly Ho-Yen continued.** The theme is Good vs. Bad. **Reading**: Apply their growing knowledge of root words, prefixes and suffixes (morphology and etymology), as listed in English Appendix 1, both to read aloud and to understand the meaning of new words that they meet **Writing**: Use a thesaurus efficiently. Indicating degrees of possibility using adverbs [for example, perhaps, surely] or modal verbs [for example, might, should, will, must] **Comprehension**: Continuing to read and discuss an increasingly wide range of fiction, poetry, plays, non-fiction and reference books or textbooks.


## Maths

**Unit 13 Geometry – properties of shapes:** Children will learn to measure angles and draw shapes accurately using a ruler and protractor, calculate unknown angles in shapes and on lines using angle facts, explore properties of polygons and circles, identify 3D shapes from 2D representations and draw multiple nets for a 3D shape.

**Unit 14 Problem-solving.** The unit builds on children's work in previous units. Children apply their knowledge and skills in problems with and without context, some of which may appear less familiar because the problem is non-routine. They represent problems using bar models to help make sense of a problem and the relationships within it, exposing the operations needed.

### Energy: Circuits, batteries and switches

Pupils will learn to:

 Revisiting electrical circuits, children learn to draw conventional circuit diagrams and use models to explain current, resistance and voltage. They compare different batteries and relate this to the effects on bulb brightness. Pupils apply their knowledge of switches and electrical circuits to design and produce their own practical devices.

#### **DESIGN & TECHNOLOGY**

Pupils will learn to:

- Develop their love of cooking by researching, investigating, and making a variety of continental foods.
- Begin to understand and apply the principles of a healthy and varied diet. This includes preparing to cook a variety of predominantly savoury dishes using a range of cooking techniques. They will learn about seasonality and know where and how a variety of ingredients are grown.
